BEEF EXHIBITOR GENERAL RULES

- **It is critically important to request special stalling on your entry form this year. Space is very limited. If you have preference to stall by county, as in 4-H, please make note of that. We will work with 4-H staff to try to utilize space appropriately for both Open Class & 4-H stalling.**
- Open Class Beef tie outs on the east side of the former Beef Complex are available on a first come-first serve basis only. Bring your own bedding.
- Duct tape will not be allowed on State Fair property.
- Vehicles parked on the fairgrounds before or after exhibitor feed pass hours will be towed at exhibitor's expense.
- The 4-H Livestock Complex and Beef Tie-Outs had electrical upgrades a year ago. Generators can be brought along and kept in trailer and used only if necessary.
- Feed, hay, and supplies are limited to a two-day maximum. Tack and feed area should be organized, clean, and maintained in stall area.
- Port-a-cools are prohibited.
- Registration papers must be presented at check-in (electronic or printed versions)
- 4-H cattle showing in Open Class shows must be checked-in during the Open Class check-in times, unless exhibitors have contacted superintendents prior to check-in.
- Group classes must be entered online at the time entries are due.
- Changes to the stalling assignments must be approved by superintendents.
- Straw is prohibited.
- Woodchips will be available for purchase for \$6/bag. They can be purchased at the Feed and Forage Building by the 4-H Beef Tie-Outs on Saturday and Sunday from 12 PM to 6 PM and Monday and Tuesday from 7 AM to 7 PM.
- Individual pens will not be allowed in tie outs. Stall dividers will be allowed in tie out area. All animals must have halters and neck ties on while in tie-out areas.
- Pumping or drenching of animals unless direct be a veterinarian is prohibited.
- Blocking chutes will require a permit/sticker.
- Tack stalls are limited to one tack stall (two ties) per family/address.
- A dual registered animal may be entered to show in each breed with paid entry, but at the end of check-in, you must declare which breed the animal will show in. Refunds will not be issued.
- Substitutions are allowed. In order to expedite the check-in process, please print the substitute form located in the back of this book and bring it fully completed to check-in or email it to Jeanette.Linke@state.sd.us by August 20. There is a \$10 fee per substitution (cash only).
- Each breed will make the decision on whether they will have a fit or no-fit show.
- Due to scheduling and tight show days, an exhibitor meeting will not be held this year. Please feel free to share your thoughts and ideas to make next year a great one!

LIVESTOCK ENTERING/EXITING FAIRGROUNDS

Sunday & Monday: All livestock will enter Gate 8

Wednesday: All livestock will exit Gate 3.5

Early release will be made available for legitimate purposes only. Exhibitors entered in another show will be required to show proof of entry to that show for early release. All Open Class Beef not showing in 4-H are asked to leave the fairgrounds or move to the Open Class Beef Tie-Outs (as space allows) on the east side of the former Beef Complex (south of the Open Class Sheep Barn).

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

- **Livestock Trailer Parking:** Livestock trailer parking is at Huron Continental Marketing located west of Huron at 39763 US Hwy 14.
- **On-Grounds Parking:** On-grounds parking is prohibited without proper and appropriate credentials. Parking passes issued to campers are valid only for the campsites. They are not an appropriate credential for anywhere else. If the vehicle does not fit within the boundaries of the campsite, the vehicle must be parked off grounds.
- **Parking Violations:** Any vehicle found on-grounds without the proper credential for the area in which it's parked is subject to towing. There will be zero tolerance for parking violations; we will no longer be making PA announcements or giving warnings. Violators will be towed.
- **Fire Lanes:** For safety purposes, any vehicle blocking a fire-lane will be towed at owner's expense.
- **Ticketing System:** The South Dakota State Fair transitioned to an electronic system at the gates for admission and parking. Admission and parking passes will have bar codes on them that will be scanned. Parking passes will be scanned upon entry and exit from the fairgrounds. Passes are only valid for the area and terms listed on the pass. The goals for this transition are to increase efficiency and eliminate any abuse or misuse of parking and admission credentials.
- **Feeding/Unloading Permit:** A feeding/unloading permit may be purchased at the State Fair Administration Office or online upon submission of livestock entry for \$20 (only one permit per family/address allowed). This permit allows entry on the fairgrounds before 9 AM and after 6 PM to feed animals and then exit immediately. This is not a parking permit and will be subject to towing if vehicle is left unattended for an extended amount of time. Permits will be scanned at gates and will only be valid during the designated hours.
- **State Fair Camping:** Exhibitors that camp on the South Dakota State Fairgrounds will be allowed to begin their camping package on Saturday, August 28. Only exhibitors will be allowed to begin camping early; any helpers or spectators must pay \$25/day for each day camping prior to Tuesday, August 31 as stated in the camper letter.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Entry Closing Date: August 1. No late entries will be accepted this year.
2. All entries must be done online at www.sdstatefair.com, and must show the Division and Class numbers, the name, registry number, date of birth, and number of sires and dams of each animal. Entries must include exhibitor's name and address, cell phone number, social security number, or federal tax ID.
3. Animals registered in two breeds can only show in one breed.
4. Nurse cows will be not be allowed.
5. No animal shall be entered in the name of any other than the proven owner or owners; and should any prove to be otherwise entered, premiums awarded will be forfeited.
6. The name of exhibitors, as printed on the entry blank, must correspond and be the same names as on the breed registration papers and W-9.
7. Entry Fees. Fees must be paid at the time of making entry. There will be a \$25.00 fee for blocking chutes. Exhibitors limited to one blocking chute per six head of cattle.
 - a. Entry Fee (excludes bedding) - \$45/head
 - b. Tack Stall - \$45/tie (two tie limit per family/address)
 - c. Blocking Chute - \$25
8. Chutes will not be allowed in aisles or stalls except for show day of the breed being exhibited. Tack stalls are limited to one tack stall (two ties) per family/address (two ties per one tack stall entry).

9. **REFUND POLICY:** The fair may refund entry fees paid by an exhibitor if the exhibitor requests the refund in writing two weeks prior to the opening day of the fair and states the reason for requesting the refund. Following that timeframe, NO refunds will be issued.
10. All cattle must be on the grounds by 8 PM on Monday, August 30. All cattle will be checked in at the southwest doors of the Nordby Exhibit Hall on Monday. Check in for Shorthorn/Shorthorn Plus, Simmental/Low %, Limousin, Chianina, Gelbvieh, Maine Anjou/Maine Tainer, and All Other Breeds will be from 10 AM – 3 PM. Check in for Hereford, Angus, Charolais and Red Angus will be from 3 PM – 8 PM.
11. All animals occupying stalls must be entered for competition and shows in their respective divisions.
12. All animals at tie-outs must be double-tied (halter and necktie). Straw in tie-outs is prohibited.
13. Check entries with superintendent/breed representative before your breed shows.
14. Registry certificates must be provided before animals can be shown in the ring and must be shown at check-in (written or electronic).
15. Exhibitors will be permitted three entries in each class but only two awards will be made to the exhibitor.
16. **GROUP ENTRIES:** Class numbers must be listed on entry blank, but animals need not be named. Animals must be entered and shown in individual classes, and name and number of each animal given to the clerk when group is shown. Group classes must be pre-entered
17. One member from any family, household, or business establishment may make entry in any Class.
18. Exhibitors will be required to keep their stalls and pens clean. Wheelbarrows will not be available. Fans must blow east to west. Butt fans and Port-a-Cools are prohibited.
19. Exhibits cannot be altered. Any animal or exhibit which shows evidence that artificial means, including but not limited to dyes, etc. were used with intent to deceive for removing or altering physical defects or conformation, shall be excluded from participation in any of the awards. Such exhibitor will be disbarred from participation in competition, and any awards or premiums previously awarded to the exhibitor will be withdrawn. The judge in each classification will have jurisdiction in the matter.
20. It is not necessary to make entries for champions. Cash award will not be paid for Breed Champions.
21. All female cattle 42 months of age must have produced a calf within the last 18 months to be eligible to show. Any bull over 36 months entered in any of the breeding classes that has not dropped to his servicing a living calf during the eight months preceding the opening day of the fair shall be deemed barren and as such, shall be excluded from competition. Certificates from exhibitors properly attested may be required by the superintendent.
22. It is required that each breed association furnishes their own ring steward and show announcer for their show. Each breed show must show in a timely fashion and follow the rolling schedule.
23. The South Dakota State Fair has adopted and will enforce the International Association of Fairs & Expositions National Code of Show Ring Ethics. A copy of this code can be obtained by contacting the State Fair office or online s3.amazonaws.com/iafe/library/2016/ShowRingCodeofEthics.pdf.
24. Woodchips will be available for purchase for \$6/bag. They can be purchased at the Feed and Forage Building by the 4-H Beef Tie-Outs on Saturday and Sunday from 12 PM to 6 PM and Monday and Tuesday from 7 AM to 7 PM.
25. The 4-H Livestock Complex and Beef Tie-Outs had electrical upgrades a year ago. Generators can be brought along and kept in trailer and used only if necessary.
26. No livestock will be allowed on the South Dakota State Fairgrounds before Sunday, August 29.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

A completed Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, listing individual animal official identification, must accompany all animals exhibited at the South Dakota State Fair. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued within 30 days of fair entry. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection written for animals originating from outside the State of South Dakota must have a telephone import permit number listed on the certificate. The consignee must be listed as: **South Dakota State Fair, 1060 3rd St. SW Huron, SD 57350**

Notice: Certificate of Veterinarian Inspection (CVI) Collection Process Has Changed.

- 1) Exhibitor presents CVI to Livestock Superintendent, or their designee, at check-in to verify they have a CVI.
NOTE: If exhibitor is showing multiple species, they need a separate CVI for each species.
- 2) Exhibitor gets stall assignment and is responsible for writing the stall number on the CVI and then puts the CVI in the CVI collection box.
- 3) AIB collects CVIs from the collection box several times throughout the day to inspect animals.
- 4) It is the exhibitor's obligation and responsibility to ensure their animal(s) are healthy and that they have obtained a CVI within 30 days of bringing the animal(s) onto the fairgrounds. **Any exhibitor found bringing an animal with obvious issues pertaining to animal health and well-being will be asked to leave immediately and will not be allowed to show at the 2022 South Dakota State Fair.**

Animals must be free of signs of communicable and infectious disease at the time of entry onto the Fairgrounds. Any determination of the health status of an animal will be at the discretion of the State Veterinarian or official representative.

CASH PREMIUM SCHEDULE

Prize money in each Beef Division will be paid on the following scale: \$75 \$60 \$45 \$35 \$30

- Divisions of 15 head or more may be split at the discretion of the superintendents.
- Groups - Only one entry per division will be paid.

To qualify for Supreme Champion competition, animal must win either Grand or Reserve Champion Bull or Grand or Reserve Champion Female in their respective breed division. Only the animal named Grand or Reserve Champion for that breed will qualify. If the Grand Champion for the breed is not present for the Supreme Champion competition, premiums will be forfeited for that animal (with exceptions due to family emergency or religion).

Supreme Champion Bull will receive \$1,000 cash prize and a semen collection sponsored by 605 Sires, Marion, South Dakota. Supreme Champion Female will receive a \$1,000 cash prize and a flush sponsored by BovaGen, Lake City, South Dakota (terms determined by sponsor).

All Grand Champion Breed exhibitors also qualify for the chance to win the use of a 24', three compartment trailer for one year: compliments of Wilson Trailer. Exhibitors of breed champions, excluding the two Supreme Champion winners, will play one hand of draw poker, one game for the bull exhibitors and one for the female exhibitors. The two winners of each hand will then play again for the use of Wilson trailer.

Yackley/Trans-Ova Genetics will award all Breed Champions both Bulls and Females at the South Dakota State Fair Open Class beef shows a \$100 credit voucher at Trans-Ova.

HERDSMANSHIP AWARD

The South Dakota State Fair will award herdsmanship awards to the exhibitors who exhibit the qualities required to sustain a premier show including: cleanliness of stalls, general neatness in care of barns and livestock, and cooperation and courtesy throughout the entire show to other exhibitors and staff.

QUIET TIME

For safety purposes and security of livestock and personal property, the South Dakota State Fair has established a "Quiet Time" in all barns that starts at 2 AM until 5 AM. Large gatherings, parties or excessive socializing will be prohibited at that time. Thank you for your cooperation.

54. COW-CALF CLASS: 36 months of age and younger as of cow's date of birth. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show, 1/1/2018 – 8/31/2019.
55. COW-CALF CLASS: Cows four years of age and older, cows must be born 12/31/2017 or earlier. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION RULES

The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year. *(rules continued on next page)*

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head).

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2: Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), except for false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

DIVISION 2: CHAROLAIS

Special Rules

All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Division must be purebred and registered with American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership—photocopies will not be allowed. *(rules continued on next page)*

An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herd book.

Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.

All animals to be eligible may be approved by a Sifting Committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the Sifting Committee.

All animals are subject to a medical examination to determine age, and each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

Bulls from Classes 36, 37, 40, 41, and 42 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2019. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2019, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA - sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTIONS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per so (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited, and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such a show.

Where circumstances exist and/or allow, AICA reserves the right to split large individual classes after the check-in procedure is complete.

- Only active adult and junior members of the ACA are eligible to show and/or receive premium monies provided by the ACA. Partial interest owners must also be active members of the ACA. Membership may be obtained by writing to the ACA, PO Box 890, Platte City, MO 64079 or by phoning 816.431.2808.
- All cattle entered must be registered in the ACA herdbook. Cattle cannot be shown with an application for registration.
- Original registration certificates must be presented to the superintendent at the show. All tattoos will be read and must agree with the registration certificate. Any animal not having a legible tattoo, or a tattoo not corresponding with its registration certificate, will be ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
- The surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of any animal is prohibited. This includes altering the conformation by tying up the dewlap or creating tucks by using adhesive on the dewlap, brisket, sheath, or navel. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
- Dyeing or artificially changing the color of an animal is prohibited. Coloring agents, except powders, may be used on the legs and tail switches. Coloring is not allowed to be used above the animal's flank. Powder of any kind or color is prohibited on any part of an animal.
- All bulls one year of age or older must have a permanent nose ring with a lead attached to the ring.
- All cattle will be made available for a veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering.
- All cattle will be made available to a veterinary examination to be mouthed.
- Exhibitor agrees to abide by the determination of the examining veterinarian(s).
- By entering cattle in this show, the exhibitor agrees to abide by all show rules. Although these decisions are sometimes subjective, they are made by the most competent, knowledgeable people available and their decisions will be final.

Exhibitors in Hereford breeding Divisions are subject to the Association's special rule on class qualification. Entries must be duly recorded with the American Hereford Association (AHA). Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show competition.

All animals, including calves at the side of cow-calf pairs, at all AHA sponsored shows must be officially recorded at show time to be eligible to show. An official AHA registry number at entry time will be required.

STANDARD RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation.
2. Must be a current paid member of South Dakota Limousin Association (SDLA) \$35 dues must be paid before allowed to show.
3. All animals must be 75% Limousin or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates or purple-papared Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Limousin and Lim-Flex shows will now be separate for bulls and females. Following NALF and NALJA rules, a Lim-Flex animal must be registered, and proof of registration must be shown with the NALF's purple registration papers.
4. All animals must be properly recorded and in the name of the exhibitor by the entry deadline of the given fair or exposition. Cattle must be entered in the exact same name that appears on the registration certificate as the current owner.
5. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must properly match the registration certificate.
6. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF) reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
 - a. Any altering of the natural color of the animal by use of dyes, paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam graphite, colored powders or any other substance.
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tailheads and false polls. False tail switches are allowed.
 - c. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue to alter the shape of the animal.
 - d. The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation.
 - e. Any attempts to disrupt or change the normal dental development of the animal.
 - f. Any products/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per so (by esophagus).
Exceptions: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by a veterinarian or NALF representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.
7. All aged bulls must show with a nose-lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Limousin show superintendent and the show management.
8. All protest against exhibitors or individual animals dealing with the age or genetic background of show cattle must be submitted in writing and signed by five lifetime members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours after the completion of the show.
9. The NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development at any show sponsored by the Foundation.
10. There are no limitations as to color or color markings of Limousin cattle shown.
11. It is recommended that if 15 or more head are entered and checked-in in any single class, the class shall be split into two equal Classes as determined by age.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine Anjou Association (AMAA). When entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide with the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the show management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the show rules, may be disqualified from showing.
2. All animals must be registered in the AMAA and the original certificate (or an application for registration with a check for fee) is required for presentation before the show. Electronic or hard copy.
3. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate (or application for registration). Other than Brucellosis Calfhood tattoo, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
4. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
5. The use of false tailheads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
6. The dying or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and color will be prohibited.
7. All animals over seven months of age must be dehorned.
8. All cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification and/or detection of foreign substances.
9. Bulls 10 months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
10. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate (available for inspection) of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian.
11. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
12. All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle also will be made available for veterinary examination to be mouthed for age verification. The Show Committee reserves the right, after mouthing by a qualified veterinarian, to remove an animal from the show or designate the animal to be shown in a different Division from that previously entered, at the Committee's discretion. An animal shall remain in the same Division as placed in at time of mouthing for the remainder of the show season, considered to be June 1 to June 1. The exhibitor shall have the opportunity to have the animal(s) remouthed at his own expense for future shows. The selection of the individual to do the remouthing shall be at the discretion of the AMAA Show Committee.

13. Exhibitors shall wear show harness to exhibit entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA sponsored shows.

The AMAA has in place an up-grading program for the registration of females. The South Dakota State Fair will offer one division: Registered 3/4 percentage and higher heifers. All heifers must be sired by a registered Maine Anjou bull.
